We are the oldest Department of IR in Australia. When we were formed, in 1949, IR was one of three departments established in the Research School of Pacific Studies at ANU. Today, we retain a close connection between theoretical work and area studies, particularly on the Asia-Pacific. Indeed, the IR Department is known around the world for the ways in which it links theory and practice with historical and contemporary analysis in the fields of Asia-Pacific politics, global histories and theories, peace and conflict studies, diplomacy and security, gender and feminist IR, ethics and governance, and political economy and law.
